AAPILC Congratulates David Chiu on Becoming San Francisco's First AAPI City Attorney

SACRAMENTO, CA -- The California Asian American & Pacific Islander Legislative Caucus (AAPILC) congratulates its former Chair, David Chiu, on being sworn into his new role as San Francisco City Attorney.

His appointment will make history, as Chiu will become San Francisco's first AAPI city attorney since the position was established over 120 years ago. Chiu is no stranger to breaking barriers and paving a path for more AAPI leaders. In 2014, he started serving as the first Asian American to represent eastern San Francisco in the Legislature. Prior to joining the Legislature, Chiu was the first AAPI President of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors. His historic career has been built on a legacy of fighting for the underserved, particularly within the AAPI community.

Diversity in leadership is critical to understanding different viewpoints and creating a California for all based on a variety of perspectives. We look forward to working with City Attorney Chiu in his new role, where he will continue to advance efforts for equity and justice for all.

"AAPIs have been in San Francisco since the early 1800s, and the first city attorney was appointed in the late 1800s.
